The Simmet Prize, established in honor of Dr. Ludwig Simmet, a pioneer in artificial insemination and founder of Minitube, recognizes active scientists for outstanding contributions to basic and applied research in animal reproduction. As the most prestigious award in the field, it is presented every four years at the ICAR congress and includes a prize of €50,000.







Impact on the field of assisted animal reproduction


